Dear Parishioners,

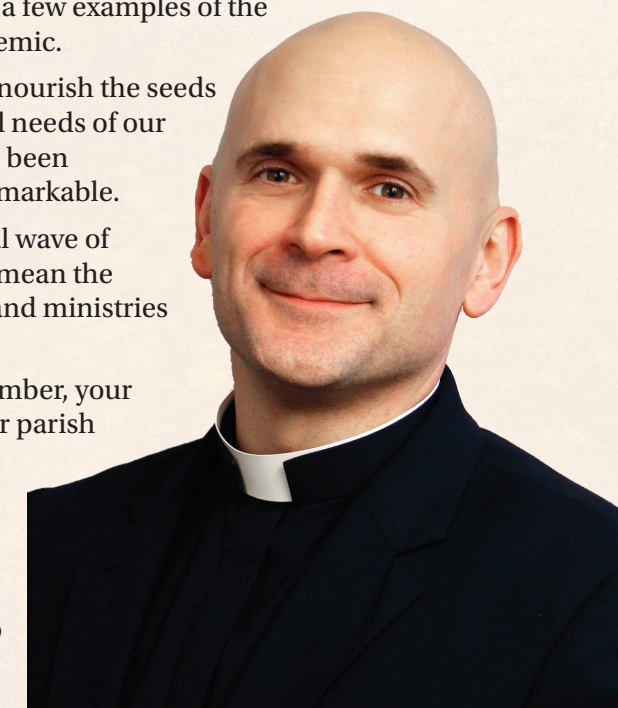

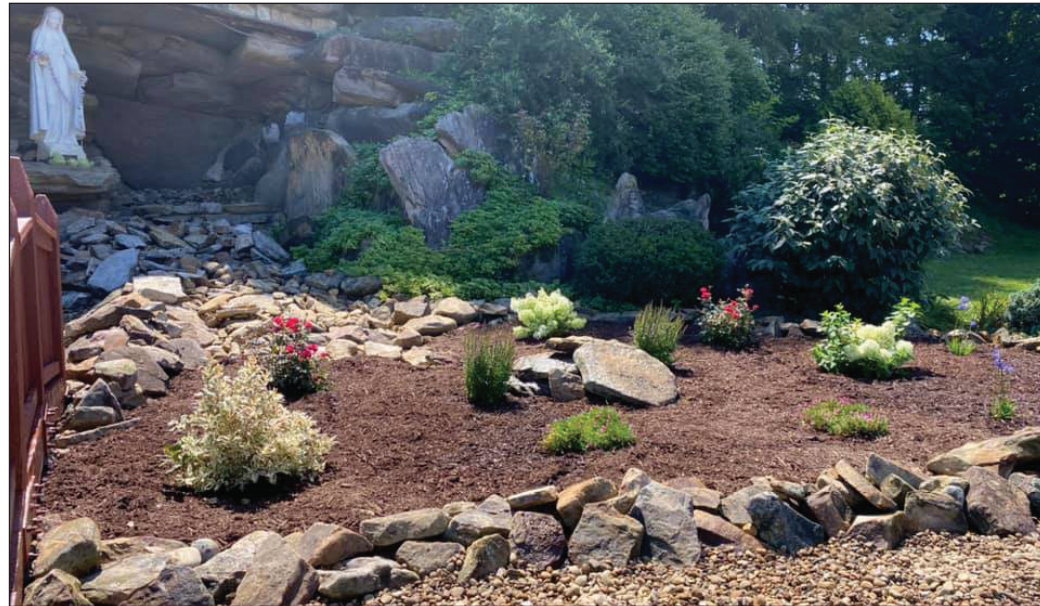

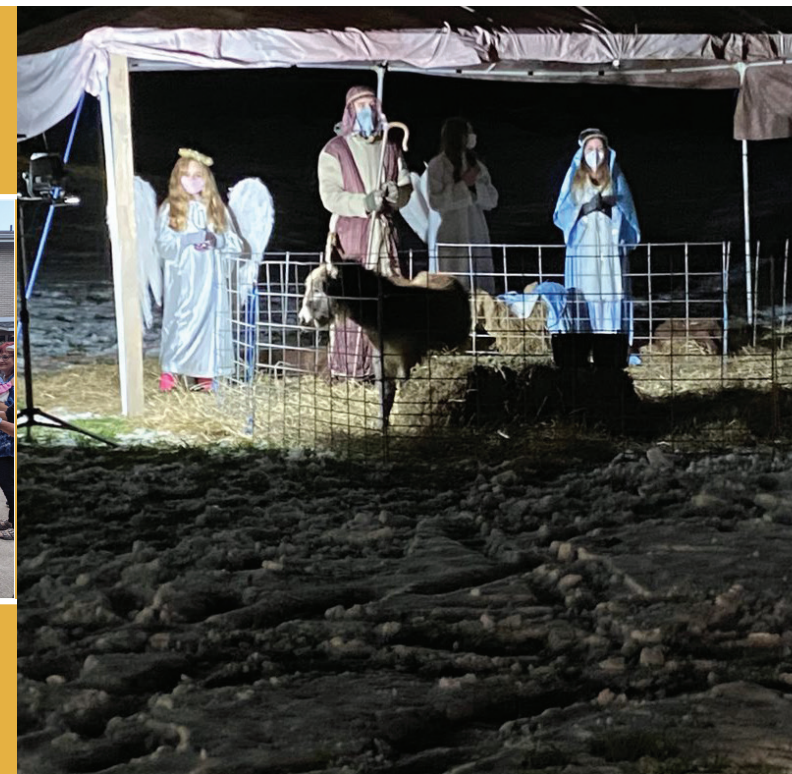

Weathering COVID-19

Just as God has provided for you, you have provided for our parish. Your investment is like the tilling of the soil, helping us to grow stronger. Despite the pandemic, our parish offertory remained strong, primarily due to the generosity of our parishioners; but it was greatly assisted by both online and mail-in giving.

As I am sure you can imagine, our parish, and particularly our societies, suffered from the loss of fundraising monies.

I do want to call your attention to our new initiative. This year in faith formation our emphasis will be accompaniment, from the youngest child born to the eldest member of the church. At any age, we have so much to offer to our church family and the community. Ministries are being developed to journey with new families, high school graduates, the families of newly baptized children and newlyweds. In the faith formation program, we the Church will be walking with the children and youth helping them to learn about God's love and also bringing God's love to others. We will implement various projects that will be displayed for important feasts and holidays, as well as other important events. We are continuing to provide and develop projects for the church community such as the live Nativity, work camp, Divine Mercy, etc. A project the youth are going to finalize is setting outdoor Stations of the Cross. We will be looking into a project with the rosary.

As we provide for the needs of the families in our church community, we also look at the larger community and our schools. We received a great amount of school supplies that went to the local schools helping those in need. We will send packages to those in nursing homes, make Christmas boxes for the homeless, make blankets and hand out baby bottles. Lastly, something cool in the process is sending correspondence to children in another country. At least once or twice a month, we will have family days at faith formation. All the parents or guardians of the faith formation students will be enjoying the time learning and growing as a church family. These efforts will go a long way in planting the seeds of faith in the next generation of our parish.
