Background

Before his election to the papacy, Pope Leo XIV served as Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops in the Roman Curia. A member of the Order of St. Augustine, he spent many years in missionary service, particularly in Latin America. His pastoral approach and deep commitment to evangelization have remained at the heart of his vocation.

"I still consider myself a missionary," he told *Vatican News*. "My vocation, like that of every Christian, is to be a missionary, to proclaim the Gospel wherever one is."

During a talk at St. Jude Parish in Chicago in August, the then-cardinal reflected on his appointment by Pope Francis, stating:

"He did not want someone from the Roman Curia to take on this role. He wanted a missionary; he wanted someone from outside; he wanted someone who would come in with a different perspective." — *Catholic Review*

Pastoral vision

Pope Leo XIV is widely known for his emphasis on humility, closeness to the faithful, and servant leadership. Reflecting on the role of bishops, he shared in an interview:

"The bishop is not supposed to be a little prince sitting in his kingdom," but is "called authentically to be humble, to be close to the people he serves, to walk with them, to suffer with them."
